MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This agreement made in duplicate this 15 day of May, 1963, is in accordance with and supplements the provisions of the Memorandum of Understanding of September 15, 1959, between the Director, Michigan Department of Conservation and the Regional Forester, U. S. Forest Service, Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

WHEREAS, The Michigan Department of Conservation desires to protect the Kirtland's Warbler on its certain nesting grounds in Oscoda County, and;

WHEREAS, The Forest Service has dedicated an area of the Lower Michigan National Forest as a Management Area for the Kirtland's Warbler and is interested in the management and protection of this rare and perhaps vanishing species of bird.

THEREFORE, in consideration of the above promises:

The Lower Michigan National Forest Agrees:

1. To post signs permitting entrance to parts of the dedicated Kirtland's Warbler Management Area between May 1 and August 15 by written permit only.
2. To furnish permit blanks to the Department of Conservation, Mio Headquarters, which upon being


issued by said headquarters will provide the proper authorization to enter upon the posted area between May 1 through August 15. These blanks will be of the same type as those used by the Forest Service in issuing similar authorization.


The Michigan Department of Conservation Agrees:

1. To authorize entrance to the dedicated Kirtland's Warbler Management Area under rules jointly set up with the Forest Service.
2. To furnish periodically a record of those people allowed to enter the dedicated area.

It is mutually agreed:

1. To adopt rules governing entrance to the dedicated area during the restricted period.
2. This agreement may be terminated by either party on 30 days notice to the other of such intent or at any time by mutual consent.
